Sixteen Weeks Old	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, Hib and hepatitis B	Thigh

	MenB	Left thigh
One year old (on or after the child's first birthday)	Hib and MenC	Upper arm/thigh
	Pneumococcal	Upper arm/thigh
	Measles, mumps and rubella (German measles)	Upper arm/thigh
	MenB	Left thigh
Two to eight years old (including children in reception class and school years 1-4)	Influenza (each year from September)	Both nostrils
Three years four months old or soon after	Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis and polio	Upper arm
	Measles, mumps and rubella	Upper arm
Girls aged 12 to 13 years	Cervical cancer caused by human papillomavirus (HPV) types 16 and 18 (and genital warts caused by types 6 and 11)	Upper arm
Fourteen years old (school year 9)	Tetanus, diphtheria and polio	Upper arm

65 years old	Pneumococcal (23 serotypes)	Upper arm
65 years of age and older	Influenza (each year from September)	Upper arm
70 years old	Shingles	Upper arm
